**This week you will practice making and testing paper airplanes using a book on MYON.**

- Access **myON** through **Clever** on the RSD Login Portal at <https://www.rentonschools.us/>. Use your school computer login.
- In the *myON* search bar type "paper airplanes"
- Select the book titled ***My First Guide to Paper Airplanes***.
- Follow the directions on pages 14-15 to create the "Hooped Glider."\*
- Experiment by adjusting how high you are holding the Hooped Glider when you release it. What do you notice about how your adjustments affect the way the plane flies?
- Make one or more of the other planes and compare their flight performance with the Hooped Glider. What do you notice?
- To learn more, search *myON* for the book "Building an Airplane."

***Invite family members to create an airplane of their choice and hold a paper airplane flying contest.***

\* You don't need fancy paper to make a paper airplane. Try using some paper from your recycle bin!

## Make Your Own Poem!

### Create a Cut & Paste Poem

- With a family member's help, go on a scavenger hunt in your house to find old magazines, junk mail, old newspapers, greeting cards, paper bags, even cereal boxes that you are allowed to cut up.
- Choose *words or phrases* from these materials that are interesting to you and cut them out.
- Arrange the words and phrases you cut out on a plain piece of paper to express a feeling or to make a statement.
- This type of poem can be as long or as short as you want. It doesn't need to rhyme.

Be creative, and have fun arranging simple combinations of words so that they are pleasing to you. Once you are happy with your result, glue the arrangement on a piece of paper.

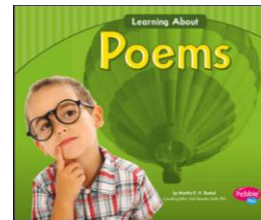


### Create a Poetry Place

Keep adding to your collection of words and phrases and place them in containers. Instead of pasting your words down on a piece of paper, place your poem on a flat surface in a place where you can share it with your family. Create, share, and change your poems as often as you wish.

## Let's read a book about poetry!

- First, log on to the District Portal
- Choose "Clever"
- Next choose "**myON**"
- Choose "library"
- Choose "Search"
- In the search bar type "poetry"
- Select the book titled "**Poems**" by Martha Rustad to get started learning about poetry!



Talk with your family after reading the book:

How are poems different from stories?

What are some things that are the same about poems and stories?

What was *your* favorite poem in the book? What did you like about it?
