

# Grade 4 eLearning Guide – Music – Week 6

## Objectives

- The students will read and perform 8th-16th note combinations (ti tika, tika ti).
- The students will sing American folk songs.
- The students will sing a song in French.

**Note: Beginning the week of April 14, and in alignment with our Adjusted Grading Guidelines, teachers in grades PK-5 will be monitoring progress of students in a variety of ways.**

## For Parents

- **WHAT SHOULD I DO TO HELP MY CHILD?**
  - Guide your child through the following activities and support your child as needed. Help them locate the videos and tools on the website.

## For Students

- **Activity #1** - Song #80 "Lost My Partner" - Watch the "Lyrics" video to learn the song. This song has two American folk songs presented, "Shoo Fly" and "Paw Paw Patch." In the video, each song is presented individually, and then both are then sung in two parts together. After learning each song, sing the first one when it goes to two parts, then try it again with the other song. In the "Interactive Activities" box, click on "Interactive Rhythm" and complete the activity.
- **Activity #2** - Song #81 "J'entends le moulin" - Watch the "Lyrics" video to learn the song. The English translation is in the "Notation" video. This song is a folk song from Quebec and is in French, and you may need to listen to it a few times to learn it. Folk songs from Quebec are often accompanied by playing spoons. If you have two spoons, try playing them together to create your own accompaniment as you sing the song. Watch the "Notation" video and see if you can identify where the ti tika pattern happens.
- **Activity #3** - Rhythm Practice: Echo Rhythm - Now that you have sung two songs with the ti tika rhythm, practice reading it in 4-beat groups. Click on "Rhythm Practice" in the menu on the left, then click on the button that says "Echo Rhythm," then click on the 7th tab that has ti tika and tika ti on it. Try echoing the rhythms presented in the videos.

## Additional Resources

- The following activities are optional:
  - If you want a challenge, click on "Poison Rhythm" and try the Oops! version of the game for ti tika and tika ti (7th tab). You will be given a pattern; the goal of the activity is to not repeat that pattern when it appears in the video.
