During A6 (April 6th - May 22nd, 2020)

Grading During Keep YES Prep Learning: Policy

For A6, students will receive equally-weighted, achievement-based grades on assignments based on the mini-lessons in each class. Grades in A6 can only improve students' scores for the semester; as such, we encourage students to correct their work, but we will not offer graded reassessment opportunities. Common Assessment 2 will still count as 7% of the semester grade, except for courses that did not test prior to closure.

NEW Partnership Schools - Campus-Specific Notes on Grades and Electives

YES Prep Northbrook MS and YES Prep Northbrook HS

As a reminder, YES Prep Northbrook MS and HS students have assignments from their electives classes, which are the classes taught by SBISD staff. YES Prep Northbrook MS and HS students can access these lessons by going to **itslearning**, which is the SBISD learning platform. Students use their SBISD username and password to login. There they can find lessons and complete assignments. Final semester grades for electives courses will be labeled as "met standard" or "did not meet standard". YES Prep Hoffman

As a reminder, YES Prep Hoffman students complete their assignments for YES Prep classes through **Microsoft Teams**. YES Prep Hoffman students do **not** need to complete assignments from their Aldine ISD electives teachers during this time. Grades for students in Hoffman MS elective courses will be taken from the first five grading periods for these courses (ex- band, choir, theatre, art I). Grades for Aldine ISD electives for the second semester will be taken from the average of A4 and A5 only.

YES Prep Eisenhower

As a reminder, YES Prep Eisenhower students complete their assignments for **both** core classes and electives classes through **Schoology**. YES Prep Eisenhower students will get a grade for their Eisenhower HS electives, and the grade will be calculated by following the YES Prep COVID-19 grading policy. Students will be able to access assignments for their Eisenhower HS electives **the week of April 27, 2020**, in Schoology.

Grading During Keep YES Prep Learning for Students in Special Populations: Policy

- For students in special populations, students will be graded on assignments on the same timeline in A6 and only on assignments with the appropriate accommodations, modifications, and supports.
- Grades in A6 can only improve students' scores for the semester; as such, we encourage students to correct their work, but we will not offer graded reassessment opportunities.

5 • Advanced Placement (AP) Testing

How will YES Prep ensure that all AP students are able to be successful in Spring 2020 AP Testing?

On AP Testing

At YES Prep we expect all students to take the AP exam for courses they are enrolled in to increase their college readiness.

On AP Fees

YES Prep families <u>will not be required to pay</u> any outstanding or unpaid AP testing fees for Spring 2020.

NEW AP Practice Tests will happen in WEEK 5 and WEEK 6.

Students will have a live practice AP exam during Week 5 (beginning April 27) and Week 6 (beginning May 4) of Keep YES Prep Learning.

The schedule will follow the same day of the week and time of their actual <u>AP exam</u> in May to provide students important practice with a similar format and routine.

The practice exam will be graded, and students will get feedback on the exam.

Each AP course will have a reduced number of assignments the week that they have their practice exam to enable students some additional time to focus.

Each exam will last approximately 45 minutes, and students should be logged in and ready a few minutes before the time begins.

Your student will receive more information from their teacher as their practice time approaches.

To support your student in having the most successful experience, please consider:

- ✓ Reminding them of the importance of the practice. Remember, success on the AP exam in May can earn them valuable college credit.
- ✓ Having them check their email to ensure they have been receiving emails from the College Board. (If not, they should tell their AP teacher.)
- ✓ Providing them with a quiet workspace with minimized distractions during the time of their practice exam.
- Reducing internet usage on other devices during this time. Avoid streaming television shows, browsing the internet, etc. to provide maximum bandwidth for their device.

If a student cannot attend the live practice, please remind them to contact their teacher as soon as possible.


