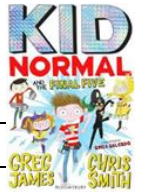

Using your <b>evaluating skills</b>, identify 3 words or phrases which you really like. Explain how and why they are so effective. Which words or phrases could the author have used instead?</p>	<p>Using the 6 or 7x table create an array. You could draw it, use marbles or buttons. Make it creative and take lots of photos.</p>
<p>Read each day, with an adult or on your own. Make sure you read different genres e.g. non-fiction, poetry, instructions such as recipes.</p>	<p>Choose a fiction book and write a review –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Who are the characters?</li> <li>• How does it start?</li> <li>• Why should we read it?</li> </ul>	<p>Log into <a href="https://childrens.poetryarchive.org/">https://childrens.poetryarchive.org/</a> Listen to a poem and write down one or more of its verses. Which poetic techniques has the poet used? Can you write your own verse in the same style?</p>
<p>Make a fruit salad using at least 3 different fruits. Using a butter knife (or a sharper knife if there is an adult to help), try cutting the fruit up into equal size pieces.</p>	<p>You have travelled back in time to Ancient Egypt. Think of a way to move the blocks for the pyramids more easily. They weigh as much as a big car!</p>	<p>Collect photos of your family and organise them into a family tree. If you do not have photos you can draw pictures of them.</p>
<p>Choose 5 of your weekly spellings and explain their meaning. Practice writing them correctly - try using different colour pencils or pens to write them out.</p>	<p>Write out the following sentence: <b>The sunlight shone dazzlingly on the azure waves.</b> Underline the verbs, circle the nouns, tick the adverbs, and highlight the adjectives. Add a simile.</p>	<p>Using a tape measure or a ruler, measure items (e.g. bed, book, window frame) in <b>centimetres</b>. Convert your measurements into <b>metres</b>, then into <b>millimetres</b>.</p>
