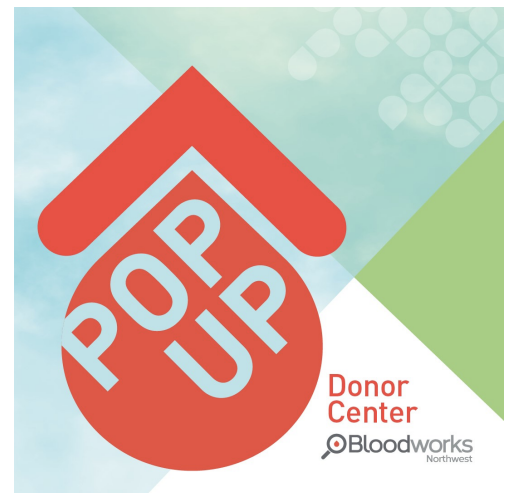
2. A Message to Our Seniors

3. Popping up near you! Give blood at our Pop-Up Donor Center this Spring

Donate in April or May at North Creek Presbyterian Church’s Pop-Up Donor Center with Bloodworks Northwest. The pop-up blood drive will be taking place at the North Creek Presbyterian Church (located next to Central Market Mill Creek) starting April 29th running through May 8th. Their address is 621 164th St. SE Mill Creek, WA 98012.

North Creek Presbyterian Church will be home to a pop-up donor center – providing an opportunity for our local community to accessibly donate blood during stay-at-home orders. Blood donors are exempt from both governors’ stay-at-home orders in Washington and Oregon, and recognize the crucial role played by Bloodworks donors in sustaining community health care, especially during emergencies. Donating blood is an essential activity critical to sustaining community healthcare, especially during emergencies.



Our community is counting on us to look after our friends, family, and neighbors by donating blood. Although hospitals are postponing elective surgeries for now, donations of all blood types are needed to support patients with cancer, premature babies, and unforeseen emergencies, among others. **All donations at the pop-up donor center are by appointment only.** The one hour donation appointment is a safe and essential action to support local hospitals. The pop-up centers are being conducted in accordance with social distancing guidelines. No walk-ins, guests, or people under age 16 are permitted onsite.
