

Every SENIOR must complete the HHS senior survey in Naviance by Monday, May 20th at 3:00 pm.

This post-secondary data is collected and reported to the state. If you are planning to attend a post-secondary institution, this is also your **final transcript request.** When you identify the institution you are attending, please make sure to check the "attending" box and the "final transcript" box. The survey can only be completed one time by each student. In order to access the survey students must:

- Log into Naviance.
- Click on the HHS Senior Survey link in the "Important To-Dos and Tasks" box on the home page.
- Click on the take this survey link next to the red diamond with an arrow.

The HHS Senior survey can also be found in your About Me tab under Surveys on the left. If you have any questions, please email your counselor.

Naviance update:

Please remember to update Naviance with your admissions decisions. This information helps other Haverford High School students and families by seeing the types of profiles of students who get into different Post High School Institutions. It is also critical for the HHS Counseling team to have accurate information to best support you and future students.

Financial Aid: FAFSA.

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) remains open until June 30, 2020. Any student or family who has not yet completed a FAFSA may still do so. Note: For those who have completed a FAFSA, and whose financial circumstances have changed considerably, we encourage you to reach out to your institution's financial aid office. Financial aid administrators are afforded a degree of professional judgment under the law for state and federal aid, as well as for institutional aid, and can work with students and families whose incomes have been negatively affected by COVID-19.

Final Decisions and Changing Deposit Deadlines:

Many Post High School institutions are pushing back deadlines to June 1 due to the interruptions being caused by COVID-19. Contacting the Post High School Institution directly and asking about any change to the deposit deadline is the best way to get accurate information.



The Admissions Offices at Post High School Institutions remain open and want to engage with prospective students. They understand the current challenges that students are facing with regard to exploring Post High School Institutions and they are determined to exercise flexibility and creativity. Please check each Post High School Institution's website to determine their virtual communication options.

Examples of virtual communication that Post High School Institutions are offering:

- Virtual experience/tour pages where students can easily engage with the school's community
- 1-on-1 video chats with admission and financial aid counselors
- Live and pre-recorded information sessions
- Webinars on various academic and student life topics
- Small-group Zoom chats with faculty
- Interactive virtual events for accepted students and their families
- Inviting prospective students to "sit-in" on their online courses since they can't attend a class on campus
- Posting on social media sites: instagram and twitter

<u>Tips on Researching Post High School Institutions Virtually:</u>

- Talk to students who attend the Post High School Institution that you are interested in. Contact the admissions office and ask them to help you connect with a student to ask them about their experience.
- Read student blogs.
- Delve into schools websites. Websites provide a wealth of information. Explore widely those things that matter to you. Visit schools websites and sign up to be on the mailing list for every school you're considering. This will demonstrate your interest to the college, and keep you updated on virtual happenings at the school: admissions information sessions, tours, and other programming opportunities.
- Read college-sponsored and student-sponsored newspapers.
- In light of the recent standardized test cancelations, many colleges are also adjusting their admissions requirements and moving to a test optional policy for first-year applicants applying for fall 2021 admission. Current juniors should pay particular attention to this.

Post High School Planning: On March 10th you received an email from the HHS Counseling Department. This email contained resources for post high school planning. Please review this email, watch the post high school planning video and review the documents shared with you in Google Drive (the Post High School Planning folder and the Financial Aid and Scholarship folder). This information can also be found on the Counseling website by clicking on Post High School Planning.

Planning ahead:

- Continue to use and familiarize yourself with Naviance to identify your interests, research careers and colleges, organize personal data, and maintain a list of prospective colleges.
- Continue to explore your post high school options by gathering information. Visit and use the Counseling website, email your Counselor, use the tools in Naviance, look at websites, and talk to friends, family and recent graduates of Haverford to gather information on careers, majors and schools.
- Attend virtual college and career events.
- Communicate virtually with schools following the recommendations listed above.
- Explore possible summer opportunities (volunteering, employment, internship or summer learning program).
- If you are interested in playing sports in college, research the National College Athletic Association (NCAA) eligibility requirements at

• If applicable, start to gather material for a portfolio (drama, music, art, sports, etc.).
