We Count Antelope Valley!

Once every 10 years, the census counts everyone living in the U.S. – regardless of age, race/ethnicity, or citizenship status. Our AV community depends on your participation. The census



is used to decide how much money our community will receive for things like, health care, job programs, housing, and schools. The census also decides how much political representation our community will have. Being counted ensures you have a voice.

Filling out the Census is Easy-

You can complete the census by mail, by phone, or online.

You will be asked a few simple questions, like your age and the number of children in your home. It is important that any children, family, or roommates living with you also be counted.
