STRATEGY: Fives + 1 More Group or Double 3's

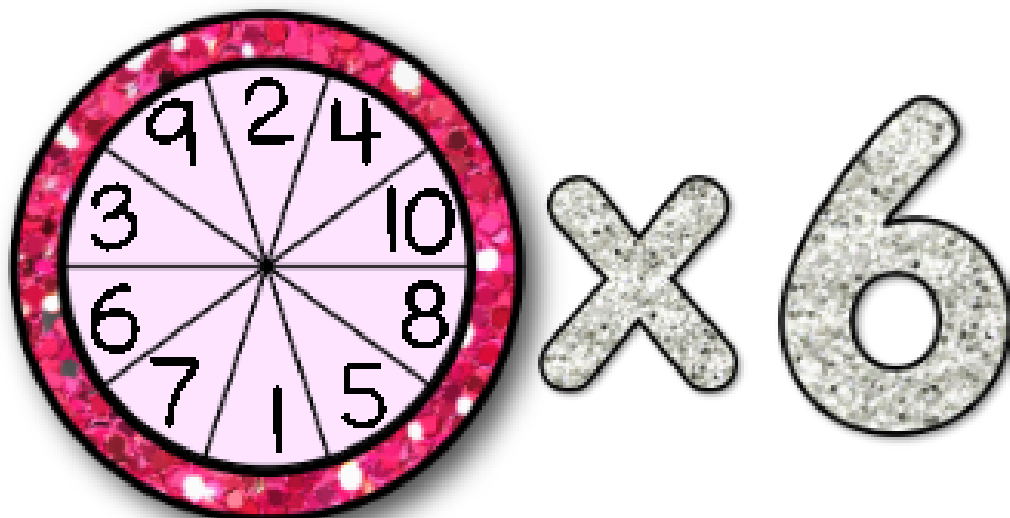
a game for 2 players

Need: 2 dice and 8 counters per player – each player uses a different color

To Play: Players take turns to roll the 2 dice, add the numbers together and then multiply the total by 6. The player then covers this number. For Example: If a player rolls 4 and 2, they would cover 36. If the other player has one counter on this number, they can 'bump' that counter off and put one of their own counters on it. You can only 'bump' when there is only one counter on the number. If that number is covered by one of the player's own counters, they can add another counter on top and then they have won that space and no more counters can be added. The winner of the game is the first player to use all 8 of their counters.

STRATEGY: Fives + 1 More Group or Double 3's
