Painting without Paint from Ms. Fargo

I have been thinking that some of you maybe be home and have no paint, so... I did some experiments with tea. Different teas make different colors. I only had a few kinds Red Zinger made what I thought was pink but when my flamingo dried he was kind of purple. Turmeric tea makes a great yellow and regular tea like Salada it Tetley makes a nice reddish brown. The greenish color is some kind with blueberries in it. I used q-tips to paint. You can get a pretty good point if you twist the cotton and go very gently. Get some tea if you have it, play around and see what you come up with, then show me. You will have to click on the link below to see my painting. Now that its dry and I know the colors I'm going to try something else. Give it a try and let's see what you can do!

Hi everyone, this is an interesting video about Andre Desjardins process while creating large scale portraits. You will be interested to see how he starts his process, there are similarities and differences to how **Studio** and **Advanced students** start their paintings. For **Drawing and Painting II students**, if we were in school, we would have started an Expressive Self Portrait much like this. For **Illustration students**, I'd like you to pay attention to the use of materials, and how as an Illustrator you don't just have to stick to marker, colored pencils, etc.

First: Watch this video

Next: Think about how he started his work

Then: Grab a piece of paper, throw any material you'd like on it! **YOU DO NOT NEED ART SUPPLIES TO DO THIS**

Examples of materials to throw on your paper: make-up, coffee, tea, dirt, grass, soap, etc.

Last: Find any drawing tool you may have and go into the thrown mark you've made on the piece of paper. Can you find an image, remember it can be anything, or a hint of image. Let your imagination take you to where you want your piece to develop! Reference what Desjardins did in the video to help with your inspiration!
