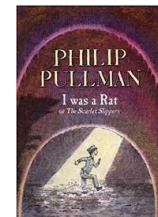


<p>Research a British painter from the 20<sup>th</sup> or 21st century. Explore their genre, style and techniques. Create a fact file / PowerPoint or magazine article based on your findings. Can you create a piece of art in the style of your researched artist? Why not send a photo of it to school on Twitter?</p>	<p>Our topic text this term is <i>One Plastic Bag</i>. Watch and listen to the text online. <a href="#">Text</a></p> <p>Research and create a presentation for your own town council to ban the use of single use items such as plastic bags, straws, coffee cups, etc...</p>	<p>Throughout history, Hastings has been an obvious smugglers' base. Imagine you have stepped back in time and are now an 18<sup>th</sup> century smuggler. Do your research to write a diary entry thinking about what you smuggle, how you smuggle and why. How do you feel about smuggling? What are the risks and rewards for doing your job? Are there any punishments?</p>
<p>Write a poem about SMUGGLING. It could rhyme, be a free verse or even an acrostic! Research the costume of an 18th century smuggler and draw a picture to accompany your poem.</p>	<p>Using your own experience as inspiration, can you write a script for television or theatre about lockdown? We may be isolated, but we are not alone, we are collectively sharing a unique experience. Write a 2-minute script that makes your family laugh, cry or feel more connected. Remember to include all the features of a play script!</p>	<p>Ron is rounding 8.2 to the nearest whole number. He thinks because 2 tenths is less than 5 tenths the number rounds down to 7. Do you agree with Ron? Explain your answer using the mathematical language of reasoning.</p> <p>Set yourself some more decimals to round to the nearest tenth.</p>
<p>Tommy is thinking of a number that has one decimal place. When he rounds his number to the nearest whole the answer is 32. What number could Tommy be thinking of. Are there any other answers?</p> <p>Make sure you use the language of reasoning to prove your answer.</p>	<p>Blow up a balloon and with the help of an adult light a candle. Hold the balloon over the top of the flame. The balloon will pop. Now fill another balloon to the top with water and then blow it up with air. Can you predict what will happen when you hold this balloon over the flame? After your experiment follow the link below to see an explanation for your results. <a href="#">Explanation</a> Now write up your experiment with your prediction, method and conclusion. Draw and label your method also.</p>	<p>Practice your weekly spellings in a variety of ways. Try putting them into a sentence. Try making a paper fortune teller for your spellings to test yourself and your family. Try creating a wordsearch with your spellings and email it to your friends to solve!</p>
<p>Create a quiz on a specialised subject that you know a lot about – maybe a topic from one of our learning journeys this year. Test your family! Who will be the winner? Why not tweet in your quiz and see if Mrs Piper-Smith or Mrs Daniel can answer it?</p>	<p>Can you make a board game to test your times tables? You should include as many of your times tables to 12 as you can, the trickier the better! Don't forget to add some 'miss a go' and 'go back to the start' spaces to make it fun! Make your board as colourful and appealing as possible and play your board game with your family!</p>	<p>On the planet Krux there are two sorts of creatures. The Zids and the Zods. The Zids have 3 legs and the Zods have 7 legs. <b>If a group of Zids and Zods have 52 legs altogether then How many Zids and Zods are there in the group?</b></p> <p>Is there only one option?
