Write a short story about what happens as when you and your friends walk through this archway.



Choose a mammal from either a hot or a cold climate and find out how it has adapted to survive in that environment. You can choose how to present your findings: in writing, as a PowerPoint or even a short film.

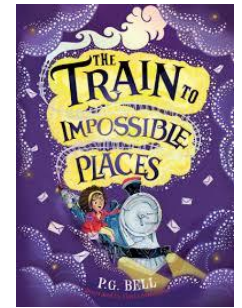
Try a new food challenge! Try eating something that you have never eaten before. As you taste it, think about the how it makes your taste buds feel. Then write a short review for someone in your family.
