Our Focus

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Equity Considerations

- Do we have technology and internet access available for every family?
 - o Families were surveyed upon the governor's closing of schools.
 - Follow-up phone calls were made by buildings to check in with EVERY family in the district
 - Plans were developed to provide technology where needed to students.
 - The district is working collaboratively with Albany Mutual Telephone as well as other resources to supply access to internet to families in need
 - Hot spots have been provided to families not covered in the Albany Mutual Telephone coverage area. (Updated 5.1.20)
- Do we have supports in place for delivery of instructional materials to homes as needed?
 - We will have biweekly pick-up times for families as needed throughout the closure period.
 - In cases where families are not able to come to the school site, transportation staff and paraprofessionals will deliver
 the learning materials to the home. Families are encouraged to contact their school building. If there is not timely
 contact, the school will reach out to the family with a phone call.

Emergency Services
