



**HAS YOUR HOUSING CHANGED SINCE WE LEFT SCHOOL? HAVE THE EFFECTS OF COVID-19 CONTRIBUTED TO YOU LOSING YOUR HOUSING? DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE IN THIS SITUATION? WE ARE HERE TO HELP!**

The McKinney-Vento Education Assistance Act is federal legislation that, in part, makes sure that students have access to education during homelessness. Homelessness is defined for education purposes by McKinney-Vento as: Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are:

- Sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason (sometimes referred to as “doubled-up”)
- Living in motels, hotels, or camping grounds due to a lack of an alternative housing
- Living in emergency shelters
- Living in a public or private place that is not meant for sleeping (cars, parks, bus station, abandoned building, etc.)
- Migratory children who live in any of the above circumstances

If you, or a family you know, are in this situation, please reach out to our Families in Transition Coordinator listed below. If you know of a family who has moved to Janesville because of their housing being disrupted as a result of finances or COVID-19, they should also reach out to enroll in our district as soon as possible.
