The Imperial War Museum website has a number of stories and pictures which celebrate the mood in Britain 75 years ago. The RAF museum and the National Museum of the Royal Navy have provided resources for a Virtual VE Day 75 Festival. There is also likely to be lots of news coverage today.

There are plenty of activities you could do at home - or perhaps help younger siblings with.

The BBC has developed a range of resources including a short video on VE day explaining the events that led to the end of the war BBC Bitesize also has some VE day themed revision guides.
