This week we are exploring STEAM activities, connecting science and collective greatness to art.

Choose one of the art lessons that inspires you to CREATE.

1. Create “My Everyday Super Hero Poster”

What is a Super Hero? Someone who protects you, takes care of you, or someone to look up to? Do you have someone in your life like that? What does a superhero need? A superpower, a symbol to represent them, secret identity, a mask, and a historic pose. There are comic books and movies about superheroes.

However, are there everyday people who do jobs that help, rescue, protect, or cure others? Is there a family member, friend, or teacher who is there for you whenever you need them? Imagine the world without these ordinary people doing their jobs or being there for you.

Do you recognize a superhero when you look one in the face? Do you think such men and women truly exist? If not, then look. In addition, think again. So who are these modern-day heroes? They are our neighbors, our friends, our family members. They are soldiers, police officers, firefighters, nurses, doctors, ambulance drivers, grocery store clerks and stockmen, artists, musicians, and athletes. And hopefully, you will come to realize that it doesn't take a cape to go out and help someone, just the desire to become an active force in your own life and see how that can affect others. It takes commitment to do what is right. Take a moment to discover the morality and conscience behind their actions, and ultimately, commit to making a difference yourself.

Celebrate and honor them. In addition, find the hero in all of us.

Design a poster that tells us everything we need to know about your Super Hero. Write the story of your Super Hero.
