Academics: Remind your child to attend subject-specific *hang outs* – teachers address the most recent lessons, as well as provide additional academic support!

In **Reading**, we continue to explore Social Issues that characters face, as well as the lessons authors are teaching. Students should be planning and logging their reading, as well as submitting reflections once-a-week. Please check out the various TOPIC folders for links, resources, and materials.

In **Math**, we are exploring volume of rectangular and triangular prisms. The students are using formulas of a triangle and a quadrilateral to reinforce their understanding of these geometric shapes. This will extend into using measurements

with fractions and decimals as well.

In **Science**, students are continuing to work in their outdoor classrooms! Garden posts,



garden math, and learning about plants and animals of the Catskills are keeping students outside and engaged!

In **Social Studies**, students completed their history mystery regarding Mummy X. Still in Egypt, students will be enjoying interactive learning experiences presented by the University of Manchester.

In **Writing**, students are finishing the research portion of their projects, reviewing gathered information, and creating outlines that will provide the foundation for rough drafts. Topics being researched vary from the current Covid-19 pandemic to the history of French fries. Next, students will be crafting their rough drafts and deciding how they wish to present their newly gathered knowledge!

Students are also reminded that each step is posted on Mondays, with the check-in on the following Monday, to support project pacing. Students still have time to choose a topic and start the process.
