Above Grade Level Testing

Benefits

- Top scores on grade level assessments show mastery of grade level
- Test ceilings are higher for above grade level tests
- Can better inform you of your student's abilities
- Insights into strengths and assist with educational planning

Recognition

- State Recognition Ceremony (meet score criteria)
- Grand Recognition Ceremony (meet score criteria)
- Summer Studies (three-week residential summer program)
- Scholar Weekends (weekend programs during academic year)
- Field Studies (two-week residential summer programs)
- eStudies (seven-week online summer program)

PSAT 8/9 SAT ACT

PSAT 8/9

- Tests the same skills and knowledge as the SAT, PSAT/NMSQT, and PSAT 10
- Helps establish a starting point for college/career readiness
- Has three testing areas: Reading, Writing and Language, and Math.
 - The Reading and Writing subject areas are combined for an Evidence-Based
 Reading and Writing section score.
 - Math has its own separate section score.
- Different from the PSAT 10 and PSAT/NMSQT in **length and scoring.**
- Records scores on a scale of **240 to 1440**. Scores on the PSAT 10 and PSAT/NMSQT range from **320 to 1520**.

Composite SAT Score is sum of two sections.	Composite ACT score is the average of the 4 sections ranging between 1-36.
Ranges between 400-1600 Optional Essay does not count toward final score.	Optional Essay does not count toward final score.
Math is ½ of final score.	Math is ¼ of final score.

ACT

Yes, you can choose which scores are sent to colleges. However some colleges require or recommend that students submit all scores. Students should review the score reporting policy of each college to which they plan to apply.

Difficulty Levels

SAT

Math- increase in difficulty as you move through that question type

Reading- questions generally follow chronological order through passage, but not by difficulty

Writing & Language passages do not progress by difficulty level.

ACT

English and Reading- difficulty level is random

Math- questions generally progress in difficulty through the section

Science- passages generally increase in difficulty as you progress through the test
