Dear Eagle Families,

The inevitable news that Maryland's public school buildings would not reopen this school year was officially announced during Governor Hogan's press conference Wednesday afternoon. **AACCS will continue remote teaching and learning for the balance of the school year. Additionally, to protect our community and support the state's efforts to reopen as soon as possible, our campuses remain closed until with no access until further notice.** This decision follows countless hours of deliberation and discernment among school leaders, taking into account the impact of this decision on our community and balancing that with guidelines and data provided by public health experts and government officials.

With respect to the coming school year, the school's leadership is researching and developing plans and safety protocols that will allow us to be back on campus for instruction and activity. I look forward to sharing details with you as more specific expectations for schools are developed nationally and here in Maryland.

Year-End Schedule

As more information posts from Maryland officials about reopening the state, I will share procedures and safety measures for digital equipment return, team uniform drop-off, and personal belongings pick-up.
