## **Collaborative Clay Project**

On Thursday 30th January and Thursday 6th February Year 3 pupils welcomed staff and pupils from the Senior School Art Department to collaborate on an exciting project inspired by Antony Gormley's art installation *Field*.

The workshops began with introductory talks and demonstrations by Ms Lewry (the Senior School Art Technician), Eryk T and Eric Z (Year 10 GCSE Art pupils). We discussed Antony Gormley's artwork *Field*, and our project

# **BOOMWHACKER** Club

Boomwhacker Club is a very popular club for Years 1 and 2, running on Wednesdays and hosted by our very own Head of Music, Miss Fox.

### What is a Boomwhacker?

A **Boomwhacker** is a lightweight, hollow, color-coded, plastic tube, tuned to a musical pitch by length. Boomwhackers are used as musical instruments in the percussion family and they were first produced by Craig Ramsell in 1995.



The children have one each and they learn to play their note at the right time and on the beat!

The note is shown on the Interactive Board and the icon jumps along and the children have to time when to play. The children seem to particularly like the woolly sheep and bird icons but there are lots to choose from.



The children are introduced to Boomwhackers in their Music Lessons during the week, so this is a great opportunity to fine tune their skills and enjoy more playing time.
