It turns out that, if I were a bird, I would be a pigeon. I revealed this to the pupils on Monday in assembly. I was hoping to encourage all of our pupils to take part in the RSPB 'Big Garden Bird Watch'. This is a project that is now in its 40th year and the data is used to monitor and promote the populations of birds in the UK. All of the information can be found on the RSPB's website which also contains the quiz to decide which bird you would be. I must admit that, after sharing this information with colleagues and pupils, that I began to feel a little low about my new feathered friend, the humble pigeon. Why wasn't I a striking goldfinch or beautiful robin? It wasn't until I delved deeper into the matter that I started to feel more excited about being a pigeon, they are amazing creatures. They can fly at the altitude of 6000 feet and at speeds of 50 to 60 miles per hour. They move their wings up to ten times per second and have the ability to identify objects at a distance of 26 miles. I'm actually feeling quite smug about being one now. I urge you to see which garden bird you are most like and sign up to take part in this year's bird watch.

This week, we were delighted to be able to delve deeper into the world of speech and language therapy with a visit from two of the therapists from 'Kids First'. Speech and Language Tips and Tricks





For Speech, Language and Communication Development at home

- Use your child's name before talking to them and ensure you have their attention.
- Speak in your home language if that is most comfortable for you and your child.
- Keep instructions short and clear. Break information into chunks.
- Use **demonstration** or **gesture** to reinforce your meaning.
- Give your child **time to process** information and respond.
- Give your child full attention when they are speaking.
- PUT DOWN your phone, TURN OFF the tv, and TALK!
- Comment on what your child is doing/playing rather than asking lots of questions (e.g. You're climbing!).
- If your child says something incorrectly, repeat it back in the correct way, but don't pressure them to copy you.
- Play Simon Says, Chinese Whispers, I Spy, I went shopping and I bought...
- Read with your child and discuss the books.
- Play board games or use other activities that encourage your child to take turns. Have some 'no screen time'.
- If your child is struggling to think of a word, encourage them to **describe** what they are talking about.
