My gaze transfixed on Jesus' face. (refrain)

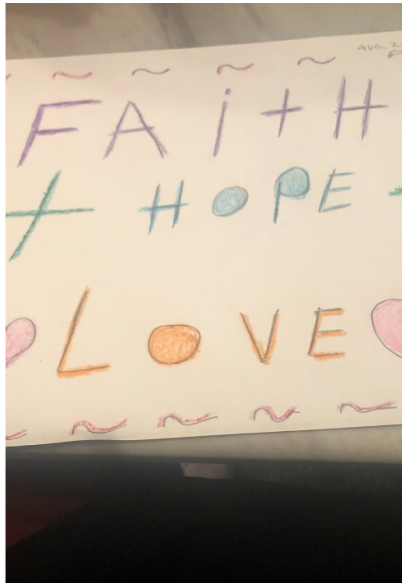
