Our community is very fortunate that we are able to continue to support our families through meal pick-up and home deliveries on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. This service will continue until June 30, even though the school year ends on June 1, 2020, with the exception of Memorial Day (Monday, May 25th). The St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry at the St. Francis Ministry Center continues to operate every Thursday evening from 6:00 -7:15 p.m., and the Alpine Chapel Food Pantry operates every Saturday from 9:00 a.m. – noon. In addition, on Saturday, May 16 the Mobile Food Pantry at The Chapel will be open from 10:00-11:30 a.m. for all community residents.
