	HB5417/5418/5419	Update to the do not resuscitate (DNR) procedure act in Michigan. Modify DNR order for patients with advanced illness, including minors; if a minor is at school and there is a DNR on file the facility would not have to take any actions to resuscitate – even basic CPR	Introduced in Jan 2020 for first reading and referred to Judiciary Committee. Referred for 2 nd reading	Link to HB 5417
	SB0826	Mental health; code; definition of mental health professional; expand to include physician assistants, certified nurse practitioners, and clinical nurse specialists-certified, and allow them to perform certain examinations. RE: Support person being allowed to be present in hospital	EO2020-37 and ADA	plan and enforce that through CMH/fair hearing process or recipient rights process.
RE: discrimination in rationing of life-saving treatment in Michigan.	EO2020-64	EO 2020-64 deals with the issue raised regarding discrimination in the rationing of life-saving treatment in Michigan. Prohibit discrimination based on disability, race, gender, perceived quality of life for life-saving equipment/procedures. We had policies that were not as bad as Alabama's but did have the effect of excluding people with disabilities from consideration for rationed life-saving treatment. A coalition of advocates including the DD Council sent letters to the Governor and they responded with a pretty good policy. Alabama withdrew its policy after advocates in that state filed a civil rights complaint with the federal Office for Civil Rights.
	EO2020-37 and EO 2020-72	EO 2020-37 has been superseded by EO 2020-72. The terms are similar.
Enhanced protections for residents and staff of long-term care facilities during COVID-19 pandemic.	EO2020-50	Prevents person from being kicked out of long-term facility and guarantees re-admittance to long-term facility if they have to leave to go to healthcare facility due to COVID-19. It doesn't alleviate the responsibility to pay for the resident. Tele-medicine use re: person in long-term care facility (nursing home, foster care, amc homes)
SE MIlarge percentage of people with COVID-	EO2020-55	Coronavirus task force for racial disparities (24 members of task force).
Direct Support Professionals: Medicaid Waiver	Medicaid Waiver	Direct Support Professionals get temporary \$2/hour raise during COVID-19 Pandemic.

Parents can utilize office hours and/or other times of the week to have teachers work directly with student.






Parents can request additional work/activities for their student.

Parents need to know that students with an IEP/504 can participate in extracurricular and other nonacademic activities.




Parents can request technical assistance/instruction in accessing virtual lessons/materials/classrooms.

Parents can agree to a delayed time frame for evaluations. Flexibility is needed on both sides.


Parents should document, document, document.
