

4 • How will YES Prep grade equitably during closure?

During A6 (April 6th - May 22nd, 2020)

Grading During Keep YES Prep Learning: Policy

For A6, students will receive equally-weighted, achievement-based grades on assignments based on the mini-lessons in each class. Grades in A6 **can only improve** students' scores for the semester; as such, we encourage students to correct their work, but we will not offer graded reassessment opportunities. Common Assessment 2 will still count as 7% of the semester grade, except for courses that did not test prior to closure.

At the End of the Semester (May 2020) - How will Semester 2 grades impact GPA?

GPA: Policy

YES Prep is committed to making decisions that are equitable and in the best interest of our students. Because of this commitment, we will include Semester 2 grades in student GPAs using a process that will determine the best academic outcome.

For each student we will:

1. Calculate Semester 2 grades both with AND without the A6 average. We will choose the higher Semester 2 average. This will make sure that A6 can only improve the Semester 2 grade.
 2. We will then include Semester 2 grades into the cumulative GPA.
- We conducted a thorough analysis of the potential impact of including and excluding S2 grades in our student's cumulative GPA. After reviewing student data and a variety of secondary and post-secondary policies, we have concluded that including final S2 grades in our students' cumulative GPAs will most value the efforts of our students and families and **bring the most benefit to our students for future college and scholarship applications.**



Grading During Keep YES Prep Learning for Students in Special Populations: Policy

- For students in special populations, students will be graded on assignments on the same timeline in A6 and only on assignments with the appropriate accommodations, modifications, and supports.
- Grades in A6 **can only improve** students' scores for the semester; as such, we encourage students to correct their work, but we will not offer graded reassessment opportunities.

5 • Summer Credit Recovery for HS Students Needing Credit

Summer Credit Recovery

YES Prep will be offering a Distance Learning Summer Credit Recovery program for any high school student that did not earn a passing grade for a core course during the 2019-2020 School Year. Due to the current closure, our Summer Credit Recovery program will be offered through an online platform called Edmentum PLATO (currently used for Spring Credit Recovery). YES Prep staff supporting students during Summer Credit Recovery will continue to utilize Microsoft Teams for communicating with students and hosting office hours and tutorials. Our goal is to ensure YES Prep students that would benefit from regaining the credit prior to the next school year have the opportunity to do so. The grading policy is on Page 4 of this document.

WHO NEEDS TO ATTEND?

The YES Prep Credit Recovery program will be available for 9th - 12th grade students that need to regain a first semester or second semester core course(s) (Math, English, Social Studies, or Science). Students and families will be informed of final grades by Friday, May 29, 2020 when the Report Cards are posted to the [Home Access Center](#). Additionally, campuses will communicate directly to any student/family that requires Credit Recovery to regain a core course(s) credit or be promoted to the next Grade Level.

If your student requires more courses, please communicate to your home campus.
Cost	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Free of charge Due to the impact of COVID, Summer Credit Recovery for the 2019-2020 School Year will be free of charge to families. Please note that this is a one-time cost waived and future Credit Recovery will have an associated cost.
Credit Recovery Dates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> June 2 or June 4: Mandatory student and family virtual meeting will take place to ensure students and families know how to sign into the program and check their progress and have an opportunity to meet the summer staff that will be supporting their student June 8 - July 1: During this window, students can work on their course(s) as their own pace. Regular office hours will be held Microsoft Teams to support students struggling with the content.
Grades	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Summer Credit Recovery grading policy will closely mirror the Keep YES Prep Learning Grading Policy. Any work not turned in will receive a 50% and the lowest a student can receive from any turned in assignments is a 70%.
Technology	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If your student is currently using a YES Prep Laptop you will receive guidance on when the laptop should be returned. If your student needs to take Credit Recovery, and is currently using a YES Prep Laptop, they can continue to use it for Summer Credit Recovery and return it at the end of the program.

In order to earn credit for the course, the student must successfully complete the program by July 1st, 2020 with a passing grade. Failure to do so will result in the student not earning credit. Depending on the course or the number of missing credits, the student will be retained or need to re-enroll in the course the following year putting them behind in the credits needed to graduate.

FAQ:

What if my student doesn't have a laptop or access to the internet? When families register, we are asking questions about this to ensure we can fill the gap by reallocating laptops and wi-fi to students that are enrolled in Summer Credit Recovery.

What if my student is retained, can they still take Summer Credit Recovery? Yes, your student can still take Summer Credit Recovery courses. Please talk to your campus to determine which courses they should register for.

How do I know what courses to register for my student for? Your students report card will show any courses they failed and did not earn credit for. If that course is a Core Course (math, English, science or social students) than they should re-take it in Summer Credit Recovery.

Can I register my student in a course to help them get ahead? No, we only offer Summer Credit Recovery to re-gain credit that was attempted and not earned.

6 • Advanced Placement (AP) Testing

How will YES Prep ensure that all AP students are able to be successful in Spring 2020 AP Testing?

On AP Testing

At YES Prep we expect all students to take the AP exam for courses they are enrolled in to increase their college readiness.

On AP Fees

YES Prep families will not be required to pay any outstanding or unpaid AP testing fees for Spring 2020.

Each AP course will have a reduced number of assignments this week to account for AP testing.

Each exam will last approximately 45 minutes, and students should be logged in to the testing platform 30 minutes early.

To support your student in having the most successful experience, please consider:

- ✓ Reviewing the [Getting Ready for Exam Day](#) checklist, including logging into the AP exam demo.
- ✓ Reminding them of the importance of the exam. Remember, success on the AP exam can earn them valuable college credit.
- ✓ Having them check their email to ensure they have been receiving emails from the College Board including their testing information. (If not, they should tell their AP teacher immediately.)
- ✓ Providing them with a quiet workspace with minimized distractions during the time of their exam.
- ✓ Reducing internet usage on other devices during this time. Avoid streaming television shows, browsing the internet, etc. to provide maximum bandwidth for their device.

Virtual Graduation for the Class of 2020 (May 29th, 30th, and 31st)

Now that students have picked up their Caps and Gowns, we can get ready to graduate the Class of 2020!

Each campus will have an individual ceremony live-streamed online at their campuses originally scheduled time, listed below. The ceremonies will be broadcasted live, with speakers joining remotely to share memories, tributes and a charge for the Class of 2020.* During the live stream, each senior will be recognized by having their name called along with their photo before the official conferring of the degrees. The Virtual Graduation ceremony will last between 45 minutes to an hour and will be personalized by the campus staff to maintain the unique culture of their class and campus, which may include video montages, messages from staff and students, and social media walls for students to engage in.
