Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer

The Family's First Coronavirus Response Act authorized a new benefit to help families who have children who are eligible for free or reduced-price school meals called Pandemic-EBT. The benefit will come on an Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card, which is like a debit card. The benefits can only be spent only on food items. All students at Boys' Latin or eligible to receive this benefit.

If you already receive EBT services the credit will be automatically added to your card. If you do not receive the benefit already cards will be mailed to the address on file with the school. The estimated amount for our students is \$370.50. All Boys' Latin students qualify regardless of household income. You do not need to sign up to receive the benefit. Cards will be mailed home in the weeks ahead and may arrive as late as the end of June.
