The outbreak of the coronavirus has caused school districts around the country to make changes these past few months, and district officials are working hard to plan for the future.

Please know that MISD is still in talks with state, local and health officials to get a better understanding of school procedures for summer and the start of the 2020-21 school year. At this time, there is nothing concrete to share, but all options will be weighed.

The safety and well-being of our students and staff members will always be the number one priority for our decision-making.

Ultimately, the Texas Education Agency (TEA) will provide specifications about school protocols, and the University Interscholastic League (UIL) will give the guidelines about athletics, fine arts and other pertinent extracurricular activities.

We have received no official word from those entities about summer or fall plans, but the situation is continuously being monitored and assessed.

Gov. Greg Abbott is scheduled to hold a press conference next week, which will hopefully provide more insight. Any updates will be communicated to the community accordingly.
