#### **Pathway to Graduation:**

You have FOUR (4) years to achieve all your graduation requirements including 26 credits, passing all state standard tests, 20 hours of community service, and submitting your High School and Beyond Plan (HSBP).

Each year we have 3 trimesters

Each trimester you have 5 classes plus an advisory

Each class is worth .5 credit

5 classes each trimester=2.5 credits

3 trimesters a year= 7.5 potential credits you can earn each year

7.5 credits X 4 years = 30 potential credits you can earn. You can start earning college credit early that can transfer.

Failed classes do not count, and you will have to retake them which can put you off track to on time graduation

### Renton High School High School & Beyond Planning Requirements

- To graduate from high school, all students must develop a High School and Beyond Plan on how they will meet the high school graduation requirements and what they will do following high school.
- 1. A student's plan, which starts in middle school and is revised as they move forward, should include the classes need to prepare for a post-secondary pathway, such as a two-year or four-year college, technical college, apprenticeship program, certificate program, the workforce or military training.

#### Required elements of the High School and Beyond Plan, at a minimum, are:

- Identification of career goals based on a career interest and skills inventory or assessment, Identification of educational goals,
- The High School & Beyond Plan must be updated each year to reflect high school assessment results and to review transcripts, assess progress toward identified goals, and revised as necessary for changing interests, goals and needs.
- The plan must identify available interventions and academic support, courses, or both, that are designed for students who have not met the high school graduation standard, to enable them to meet the standard.
- All 9<sup>th</sup> grader complete the initial plan in High School Success class and then will work on it each year in Advisory



## Tips for Being Successful in High School




 Figure out what will help you be organized: a binder, folders for each class, handwritten or typed notes, etc.

 Staying organized starts with an organized backpack/binder/notes/planner.

Find another student or an adult to help you laccountable.

- Limit your distractions in class, prioritize your learning!
- Get enough sleep, fresh air, drink a lot of water

## What is GEAR UP? Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs

- Funded by the U.S. Department of Education
- 7-year federal grant, designed to increase the number of students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education
- Includes all students in classes of 2024 & 2025





#### **GEAR UP Achievers – South King County**

Our goal is to dramatically increase the number of students who enter and succeed in post-secondary programs

- Grant is focused on South King County (Renton, Kent, Auburn, Tukwila)
- Specific support for first generation, low income, and students of color
- Began 2018-2019 school year, 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> grade (Class of 2024 and 2025)
- Follow students from middle school through high school/postsecondary programs
- Focus on STEM



#### GET READY, GET SET, LEARN!

#### 7:20 AM - LEARNING BEGINS

- Students are expected to arrive to all classes on time.
- You will need a kiosk pass to enter all classes if you are 9 minutes late.
  - (kiosk is located in the main office)

Frequent kiosk users will be contacted by our intervention team to promote an on-time arrival for academic success.



- ☐ Students should miss no more than 9 days of school to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduate
- ☐ Missing 10 percent or about 18 days of school will drastically affect your academic success
- $\square$ 2 absences per month x 9 months = less likely to graduate from high school
- ☐ Students can be chronically absent even if they miss a day or two every few weeks.




