## Scholar Superstars

**J.J. Tijerina** (7th grade at Northeast Middle School) – Mr. Tijerina is a bona fide hero. On Friday, Aug. 26, he and his buddies Matthew and Michael Rich rescued several people who were trapped in their cars after attempting to drive through a flooded underpass at Askew and Truman streets, according to several local news reports. The trio of courageous young men saw the cars stalling and decided they weren't going to just ignore the problem. Instead, for several hours in monsoon-like conditions, they braved the flood waters to help drivers make it to safety. To put this in context, the water at one point reached almost six feet high.

Adrianna Schoonover (12th grade at Lincoln College Preparatory Academy) – Ms. Schoonover has become an integral and highly valued member of the KCPS Communications and Community Engagement (CCE) Team. For the last two years, she has helped produce numerous videos for Board meetings, athletic competitions and other school and KCPS events. This summer, she served as one of the CCE Department student interns and made enormous contributions while planning and executing multiple communications and community engagement projects, including Dr. Bedell's first day, the Summerfest back-to-school festival and the annual staff Convocation. Some of her outstanding work includes a video honoring Al Tunis' term as Interim Superintendent, a video featuring Superintendent Mark Bedell's early visits to KCPS, and the Convocation review video. Adrianna is bright, insightful and cheerful, and consistently takes the lead on projects. She is a credit to her family, her school and KCPS.

## **Community Champions**
