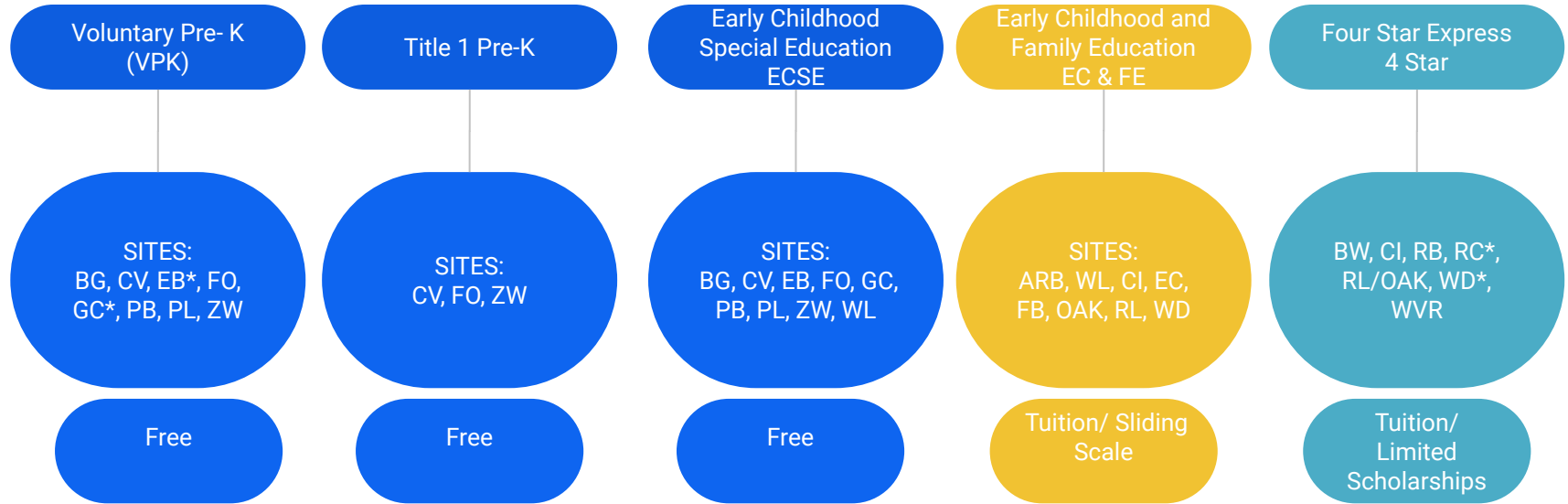

# Adult Basic Education

- ▶ Program out of Northwest Family Service Center (NWFSC)
  - ▶ Program out of Willow Lane
  - ▶ Additional spaces for classrooms, family literacy learning, staff, technology, and storage would allow for increased programming.
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# What has changed?

- ▶ VPK funding created for FY 17, 8 sites received all or partial funding
- ▶ Additional VPK funding granted in FY 18, with created one additional classroom at EB and fully funded BG
- ▶ Increased School Readiness and Pathway funds for EC & FE through Legislation
  - School readiness increased from FY17 of 390 to FY20 (Year to Date) 489 students.
