 - A) How did warfare change during the Hundred Years' War
 - B) How did warfare stay the same during the Hundred Years' War

Finally, choose **ONE** of the following long-form essay prompts and create an essay with a thesis that addresses the prompt. The essay does NOT need to be typed.

- 3) Assess the extent to which the Black Death affected social, political and economic structures in the 14th Century. (Please look up the term "assess" if you don't know what it means as well as social, economic and political definitions).
- 4) Compare and contrast the 14th century peasant revolts in England with the 14th century peasant revolts in France and evaluate the effectiveness of both revolts on furthering peasants' rights and status in medieval Europe.
