

aunt
(noun)

1. One **aunt** is his mother's sister, and the other **aunt** is married to his father's brother.
2. Cousin Pepe's mom is my **aunt** (*tia* in Spanish), not my uncle.
3. My mom and her sister, **Aunt Helen**, are best friends.

baby
(noun)

1. A **baby** is a child who is too young to talk or walk.
2. A **baby** cat is a kitten.
3. A **baby** is the same as a newborn or an infant.

brother
(noun)

1. A **brother** is a boy who has the same parents as another person.
2. My mom took my **brother** and me to a football game.
3. We were all very happy when my little **brother** was born.

cousin
(noun)

1. My **cousin** is my aunt's son.
2. A **cousin** can be a girl or a boy.
3. My **cousin** is not my sibling.

father
(noun)

1. Your **father**, not your mother, is your male parent.
2. My **father** taught me how to fish.
3. A man must have a child to be a **father**.

grandfather
(noun)

1. Other words for **grandfather** include grandpa and granddaddy.
2. My **grandfather** tells great stories about his childhood.
3. The male parent of either of your parents is your **grandfather**.

grandmother
(noun)

1. To become a **grandmother**, a woman must first become a mother.
2. A **grandmother** (*abuela* in Spanish) is a female grandparent.
3. My **grandmother**, who is my father's mother, lives with us.

great-grandmother
(noun)

1. My **great-grandmother** is married to my great-grandfather.
2. Your **great-grandmother** is the grandmother of your mother or father.
3. Some people call their **great-grandmother** Great Grandma.

mother
(noun)

1. A **mother**, not a father, is the female parent.
2. A pregnant woman will become a **mother**.
3. My **mother** read me a story last night.

1. A **parent** has at least one child.

sister

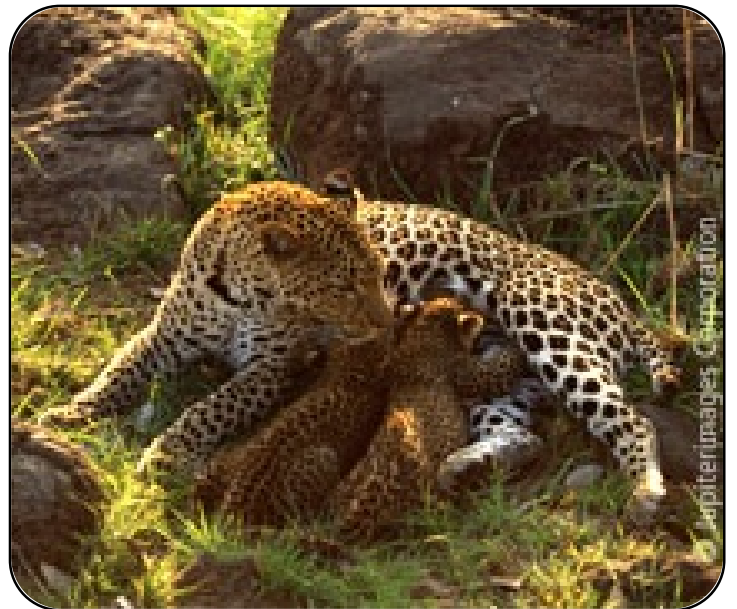
