- Minutes from March meeting were approved
- Principal Report David
  - How to manage fundraising for the remainder of the year?
    - Annual Fund, Big Give (May) and Jogathon
    - Is it appropriate to make an ask given economic situation?
      - Discussed alternatives to Jogathon that include student participation and competition such as a Read-a-thon?
      - Consensus that it may not be sensitive to ask at this time
  - Which school activities should come back and how can we be creative in how they are executed?
    - Be creative to allow the milestone SHS student events as best we can including Passion Play, Retreats, Graduation
- Committee Reports
  - o Finance
    - Financing to date is running favorably
    - Tuition and fees are favorable
    - \$140K favorable for auction vs. budget
    - \$63 for annual fund vs. budget
    - Expect neutral actual vs. budget for expenses
    - Concerns about rest of year finance impact due to Covid shut down including:
      - Lower parish subsidies from parish
      - Impacts of closure on fundraising activities including Annual Fund, Jogathon, ESS, delayed payments of tuition from families that have lost income (cash flow issue vs. loss of cash)
  - Technology
    - TEAMS staff training has been a success
    - Discussion of training for next round of remote learning
    - SHS compiling best practices for lessons learned in development of remote learning to help other catholic schools in the archdiocese
  - Legal No report

- Facilities
  - SHS received 3 bids mid-March for the campus upgrades
  - No economic advantage to doing all the work in one summer vs. multiple phases
  - Archdiocese has put a hold on new or current projects that are not essential or almost completed
  - Maintenance staff is working regular hours to get ahead of summer projects such as repairs, waxing floors
  - SHS will not be hiring additional maintenance staff for the summer
- Health & Safety
  - ESS staff are providing support to parish members that need assistance due to Covid
  - Delectable Catering is making lunches in coordination with Bellevue Boys and Girls Club and Amazon
  - School mass is being held via Facebook
- o Parents Club
  - Distinguished Teacher/Staff awards will move forward. Nominations due on April 24.
  - School supply lists are being finalized
- o New Business
  - Washington DC trip has been moved to June 14-19
