## Stamped by Jason Reynolds and Ibram X. Kendi

A gripping and fast-paced history of racist ideas in America written specifically for adolescent readers that shares a hopeful vision for an anti-racist future. Reynolds, who is the 2020-2021 National Ambassador for Young People's Literature wrote this book as a "remix" of Kendi's National Book Award winning *Stamped from the Beginning*. This book is recommended for: history buffs, sociologists and social justice advocates.

#### Scythe by Neal Shusterman

This fantasy-adventure novel takes place in a world without disease, hunger or war – and in which life can only be ended the mysterious Scythes.
