The group acts collectively in providing advice to the Board in areas regarding health and safety issues within the district. Activities/Accomplishments for 2019-2020:

- Minutes posted to the SAISD website under Health Services
- Bleeding Control stations were state mandated for each campus. Employees have been trained using the Stop the Bleed program. All kits are in place and were donated by the Concho Valley Regional Advisory Council.
- Other safety improvements include additional cameras and upgrade to digital radios.
- Betty Teston with the Texas Hunger Initiative reported their feeding program was a success over the summer.
- Six new RN positions and four medical assistant positions were added to the Health Services Department for this school year.
- Immunizations are within the 95th percentile at the state level.
- All screening results are now entered electronically in the district computer system for easy access.
- The West Texas Hunger Summit was held at Education Service Center on 2/27/2020.
- KIDS Marathon and Little Olympics were scheduled for April, but cancelled due to COVID 19.
- The March and April meetings were cancelled due to COVID 19.
