

Senior Practicum Summer Assignment

SUMMER ONE-PAGE ESSAY

THE ASSIGNMENT

You will write a one-page essay in which you identify a problem in the world. The goal for this essay is for you to prove that this problem is, in fact, a problem. Your essay will include the following components:

- [MLA format](#)
- [A Claim](#) that argues that the problem you've chosen actually exists and is a problem that negatively impacts the world.
- [Evidence](#) that has been gathered from at least [two credible sources](#). The evidence that you quote and cite should be used to clearly show/prove that the problem exists.
- [A Works Cited](#) page that includes all cited sources and is formatted according to MLA guidelines.

This assignment will be due to your Senior Practicum teacher on the first day of class in the fall.

THE RUBRIC

Since it is the tool that your teacher will use to evaluate your assignment, you should familiarize yourself with the rubric before you begin work on the assignment. It would be wise to reference this rubric frequently while you work.
