Wellington College Young Singers Choral Day

Twenty-four members of the Chamber Choir visited Wellington College to take part in their Young Singers Choral Day.

The day was led by Peter Hunt, one of the UK's most respected choral trainers and conductors. With over thirty-five years' experience Peter was the inspiration behind the VOICEWORKS series of handbooks for singing and in 2005 he launched SONGSTREAM, a collection of arrangements for mixed voice young choirs with fellow English composer Bob Chilcott. He has specialised in leading singing projects in schools, conducting the Berkshire Youth Choirs and Early Years Music and is in

demand as an adjudicator and vocal clinician.

The day concluded with a short concert for parents in Wellington College's Performing Arts
Centre. It was a really fantastic opportunity for the children to work with choirs from a number of other schools under such an experienced vocal and choral coach.
