We have been given information about a ten year old boy called **Harry** who lives in Fleet and whose passion is playing football. Sadly he was diagnosed in 2018 with scoliosis, a curvature of the spine, which has got progressively worse over the last year and he now has to wear a body brace for 23 hours a day. His only chance of leading the life he would like to lead is to have surgery which is only offered in the US. His family need to raise £25,000 for the operation and his living expenses during his post-operative recovery time in the USA.

We would very much like Yateley Manor to be able to help Harry and will be running a couple of events to raise money that will hopefully not detract from the money that we always raise for our charity of the year. Harry knows several Yateley Manor children from playing for Fleet Spurs and from his infant school and is particularly close to one Yateley Manor family.

The staff will be holding a cake sale for Pre-Prep and Prep children on the day we finish for half term, Friday 14th February. Year 4's Bollywood Dancing Afternoon



On Monday, the Year 4 children had the wonderful opportunity to experience some 'real life' Bollywood dancing, as part of their topic of India. A dance instructor, who has herself starred in and choreographed Bollywood dances, came to instruct the children. She taught the children a number of moves including the classic lotus and the peacock. The children picked up the routines amazingly well and thoroughly enjoyed performing their dances to the rest of the year group at the end of the session.

Year 7 Visit Centre of the Cell

Year 7 travelled to London to visit the Centre of the Cell, a science education centre based at Queen Mary, University of London. It is the first science education centre in the world to be located within working biomedical research laboratories. The group had 90 minutes of cell discovery work inside the distinctive orange Pod suspended above the laboratories in the Blizard Institute and were able to see research laboratories as they entered the centre. Once inside, Year 7 learnt about the amazing world of cells, the human body and the latest medical research. There were cell games to play and real human organs to study. Interestingly, they found out how human skin can be grown and how long it would take to grow enough skin for a full human body.

After lunch, the children took part in a science show called 'Cellebration' which was filled with fantastic information and games. At the end, some children were looking at how to specialise



a stem cell into other types of cell - a skill that has already been built upon in lessons this week. It was a great day at the Centre of the Cell and the Year 7 children will be able to apply a lot of the learning that took place, in their lessons back at school.
