## Summer Uniform

A few reminders about summer uniform:

Summer uniform for girls is the regulation summer dress with white socks.

Boys may wear grey shorts and grey short socks. If they would like to be in short sleeves then they will need to wear proper short sleeved shirts. Long sleeves rolled up are not acceptable, so children wearing long sleeves will have to keep them rolled down. Boys are also expected to wear their ties in school unless given specific permission by the class teacher to take them off; they are allowed to take them off when outside at break times.

Blazers should be worn as usual unless children have permission to take them off.

Pupils should not wear sports socks when in uniform.

Summer uniform is not compulsory until the second half of the summer term but may be worn earlier.

## British Science Association Poster Competition



## Exam Revision Booklets

The internal exams for children in Years 5 to 7 begin early next term. Revision booklets for Years 5, 6 and 7 were sent home during the week.

Please check that you have your booklets. Spares are available from School Reception.

Revision booklets for children in Year 8 whose exams are also next term will be sent out after we return from Easter.

## Chess Masterclass

Chess masterclass will begin on the first Tuesday of next term, 21st April, for Group A. Groups for next term will remain the same as for this term. Letters about next term's masterclass sessions were emailed home.

## School Council, Sports Council and Food Committee Elections

Elections for these Prep School Committees will take place on the first Thursday of next term.

Pupils from Years 3 to 6 who would like to stand for election to one of the Committees and have not represented their year group on any of the committees before should let their Head of Year know by the end of school on the first Tuesday of term.

## Important Notice

Our assumption is that children stay at Yateley Manor until the end of Year 8. The usual term's notice (on or before Monday 20th April) is required if this is not the case.

## Cricket Equipment

Please note that boys and girls do not need to have their own cricket equipment for the cricket season. The school will provide all that is necessary. Many children, however, do like their own equipment and this is up to parents. The school white polo shirt is required for lessons and can be used for cricket, athletics and tennis. Trainers can be used for cricket matches, but must be mainly white. Proper cricket shoes are ideal but not compulsory. Cricket spikes are not allowed on our astro wicket.

Boys and girls in Year 5 upwards who are playing hard ball cricket must wear the school cricket shirt for matches which is available from the school shop. White cricket trousers are also needed for A and B matches.

Kit for Incrediball cricket for boys and girls will consist of a white polo shirt, blue shorts or skorts and white socks.

U8 and U9s (Years 3 and 4) can also wear their white polo shirts and blue shorts for matches.

No club kit is allowed in school matches. School cricket jumpers and cricket hats are also available from the school shop.

## Handwriting Pens

Parents are reminded that children in Year 3 upwards require handwriting pens. In Year 3 these are used in handwriting lessons for familiarisation. Pen is introduced in Year 4 and by the end of Year 4 most pupils will be writing in pen.

Pupils should use washable blue ink only. A shaped pen which assists with grip such as the Stabilo Move Easy is ideal for Year 3 and 4 children. The use of fountain pens is encouraged for children from Year 5 onwards.

Correction fluid such as TIPPEX and ink erasers are not allowed in school.
