## The Big Bash

The last Thursday of term is the day for Yateley Manor's very popular Christmas Bash! We anticipate a fun packed afternoon and the children are already busy organising their activities. Prep children organise themselves into small groups and come up with an idea for a game or a stall. It is up to them to collect together everything they need and make sure that they bring it all into school on Thursday morning. The children are given time in the morning to set up their stalls in the Fyson Blum Hall before the event in the afternoon. All games stalls will have a maximum price of 30p a go or two for 50p. Although the emphasis is on fun, all money raised will go to this year's school charity, Babies in BUSCOT Support.

We very much hope that parents will support children in their ventures and allow them some spending power on the day.

Children from Years 1 and 2 are also invited to join in the fun in the afternoon. They may bring in small change (maximum of £5) in a named envelope to be handed to their form teacher at the start of the day. Envelopes will be returned to the children in the afternoon before the start of the Bash.

The Christmas competition is to be *Christmas Hats* (see separate article) and is open to children in Years 1 and 2 as well as those in Years 3 to 8. Children should come to school in their normal uniform and bring their hat with them for the afternoon.

The Christmas Bash is always very popular with the children and we would like to thank all families for their support. Unfortunately we are unable to accommodate ex-pupils at the Big Bash.

Children whose parents have attended the Carol Service are free to go home afterwards. Children will return to classrooms to collect belongings and parents should meet them outside Manor Court. Children in Prep whose parents have not been to the Carol Service will be dismissed at their normal times. Pre-Prep children must also be collected at their normal times. The School car park will be very busy between 3.50pm and 4.30pm so please avoid this time if you are a Pre-Prep only collector. **The Nursery will close at 4.00pm**.
