## Sports Match Procedures

Parents are always welcome to attend matches against other schools on Wednesdays or Fridays, whether home or away, to watch and support the children.

Match tea is often provided for parents and for the players. Children are expected to stay for this whether at home or away and we ask all parents to support us in this.

After home matches parents should meet their child outside the Fyson Blum Hall under the canopy.

Parents may take their children home after away matches (rather than them returning to school on the coach). If your child is going home straight from the match please be sure to speak to the member of sports staff who is managing your child's team before you leave so their name can be checked off their list.

If you have asked another parent to collect your child after an away match it is vital that you email Becky Ellis or Pete Daines **before the match** so that they can let your child's team manager know that they have your permission.

Children who return from away matches on the coach should change back into their uniform before leaving school.

Please note that the only drink required during fixtures is water. Children should bring their own water bottles but we would request that they do not bring in any sports drinks, many of which ironically lead to dehydration rather than rehydration due to their ingredients.

Parents are also asked not to bring sweets or chocolate snacks for the children during matches.

## Music Practice Club

Music Practice Clubs will be running again this term as an after-school club every evening except Wednesdays. The club is open on Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays to all children in Years 3 to 8 and on Thursdays to children in Years 1 to 8 who learn a musical instrument, whether in or outside school. The purpose of the club is to provide an opportunity for independent practice, taking advantage of the fantastic practice room facilities in the Music School, under the supervision of Mrs Gough, the school violin and piano teacher.

The session is pupil-led, but with Mrs Gough on hand to provide guidance, help with theory, aural or to accompany students working towards a performance. There are also opportunities for children to work together if they wish, and to perform for each other should they want to.

Any pupil wishing to attend the club should sign up during the day in School Reception. Then come and get your music practice ticked off the list before you get home!
