The Graduate Job Market

400,000 graduates leave UK universities each year

Top 100 firms recruit just under 32,000 graduates



76% of students get a First or a 2:1



Graduates who have had no work experience are unlikely to be successful during the selection process and have little or no chance of receiving a job offer.

CV and Cover Letter

CV

1 page only

Name, personal e-mail

address, mobile number

Highlight skills not just a list of things you have done

Double check for typos

Cover Letter

- 3 paragraphs:
- Introduction to job. Why you want to work for that company
- More detail about particular division / job. Why you want to work in that area
- 3. Sell yourself



LinkedIn

- Professional photo
- Start creating your own network
- Choose relevant interests
- This is not facebook!





Work Experience and Activities


- Make sure you get lots of work experience



Selection Process

- Apply online
- Online assessment
- Interview in person or online
- Assessment day
- Pass the checks





- Do your research
- Don't leave preparation until the night before
- Demonstrate an understanding of the company and its values
- Practise common interview questions

Applying for Work Experience and Internships

There are a number of things that you can do to increase your chances of getting work experience and internships. If you plan to apply for a Spring or Insight Weeks, it is worth being prepared before you start university, since many applications open before term actually starts.

A Spring or Insight Week is a placement undertaken during the Easter holidays of your first year at university. They have become more important in recent years as companies seek to identify high-potential candidates as early as possible. They are very competitive as they not only give you valuable work experience but can also fast track you onto summer Internships the following year. Many of the top graduate employers offer these programmes.
