

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Medication Preparation for next school year

Please bring the applicable form(s) to your healthcare provider to complete prior to the upcoming school year. A new medication form is required for each school year.

Administration of Medication

Prescription and over the counter medication administered at school requires a written order from the medical provider and must be signed by the parent. Students may bring in cough drops to be kept in the nurse's office and a required note from the parent stating that student may use cough drops while in school.

End of year medication pick up

Medication picked up by the parent/guardian scheduled for June 8, 2020 during the time slot for your student. If unable to make this appointment, please contact the school nurse.

Immunizations

Pediatrician Offices are accommodating families in need of mandated physicals and vaccinations. Please do not avoid going to the pediatrician if you child is sick or needs to be vaccinated. The national vaccine tracking system has noticed a decrease in immunizations which may indicate that U.S. children and their communities face an increased risk for outbreaks of vaccine-preventable disease (taken from CDC, May 15, 2020).

Our goal for the year is to keep families informed about grade level curriculum in Art, Library, 5th Grade Band, Music, and Physical Education, and how they can support their children at home.



Here are a few ideas to keep your child's creativity flowing this summer:

- 1. Keep a sketchbook! Any notebook will do; no fancy art supplies necessary. Keeping a sketchbook is a great way to keep drawing and creative thinking skills sharp. The best part of keeping a sketchbook is that it is completely unique to each individual. Your child can fill the pages with whatever his or her imagination dreams up. If your child starts to get frustrated with a drawing, it's easy to flip the page and try again! At the end of the summer students can flip through and see their progress. Sketchbooks are great companions on vacations, road trips, or even on visits to parks and museums.

Four things you can do over the summer (or anytime!) to support your child in music

- 1. Sing to and with your kids: Really! Any song! This is the #1 best thing to do for your child's musical development. Regardless of your skill level, you are the best model for your child and by doing so, you are modeling an aptitude for music making. Children who have parents who say, "I can't sing" or "I don't sing" are likely going to have the same attitude for life! Singing is a part of life. We want our children to sing lullabies to their children and be able to sing "Happy Birthday" to their grandchildren. You don't have to be an Adele, Aretha Franklin, or a Luciano Pavarotti. Just sing! :)
- 2. Play with sound: I know some of you have already done that with the "kitchen music" activities we did in music. Fill a bin with small instruments to make a musical toy box for "playing music" at home. If you don't have any instruments you can make them! (Here are 51 DIY musical instruments https://feltmagnet.com/crafts/Music-Instruments-for-Kids-to-Make) Then let the kids make some noise! There is definitely a difference

- between noise and music, but many kids need to experiment with sound before they can create with sound.
- 3. Change the station and have a dance party: Try listening to a variety of music. This will broaden your child's taste in music and help to develop their musical ear. Try making a Pandora station or Apple Music/Spotify playlist for your kids.
- 4. Take advantage of the many FREE online concerts/watch parties and musical events that are currently being offered. Enjoy your summer!

5th Grade Band

If you have your instrument during the summer, definitely keep practicing! Of course you can look ahead in your band book, but you could also get creative and move outside the book! Think about songs you'd like to play and try to figure out the notes by ear. (Send any requests to Mrs. M before the end of the school year, and she can help you get started on your request songs!) Print out some staff paper (https://www.blanksheet-music.net/) and try to write it down. Or look up some music tutorials online-- there are some great "How to play" tutorials that step you through lots of great songs! Use the blank staff paper to write your own songs. Send any masterpieces (written or performances) to Mrs. M at lindsey.macnabrenauld@stongingtonschools.org. Most important of all, have fun playing and sharing music with others. Put on a concert for your family, or perform a virtual, socially-distanced concert for family and friends. Contact a band friend and try to play FaceTime duets. Have a wonderful summer!

- -Student internet use on Chromebooks continues to be monitored.
- -Budget planning for school year 2020-2021 is in the works.

- -Re-entry planning will be explored for next school year.
