



Students that reach 10th grade on track and on time are 4x more likely to graduate







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




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Alum Rock Continuum of Care






After-School Enrollment

City Year has consistently served on average a fifth of the total student enrollment at our partner schools every day after school.

City Year runs Monday through Friday, until 6pm, from the first day of school until the last day of school.





SBAC Improvement



Proficient --> Advanced
Below Standard --> Proficient
Far Below Standard--> Below Standard

For the 12 ARUSD schools that City Year serves, students who received City Year tutoring are 43% more likely to move up one performance band in SBAC than students who received no tutoring.

In total, 156 City Year tutoring students moved up one proficiency level compared to the year before.




<u>Academic Support</u>

After receiving City Year tutoring support during the school day, 75% of students receiving support in math finished the past semester with a C or higher.

81% of students receiving literacy support finished the semester with a C or higher in English Language Arts.
