PARENT ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES

IT IS IMPORTANT FOR PARENTS TO BE INVOLVED AS THEIR CHILD PREPARES FOR WEEK WITHOUT WALLS (WWW). PARENTS ARE ACTIVE PARTNERS, OFFERING SUPPORT AND ENCOURAGEMENT FOR THEIR CHILD TO APPROACH WWW WITH A GROWTH-MINDSET AND ALLOWING THE STUDENT TO VIEW WWW AS A FUN, MEANINGFUL LEARNING EXPERIENCE.

STAY INFORMED

The best way parents can support their child is to stay informed and engaged. It is highly encouraged for at least 1 parent to attend the parent meetings and read the information shared by the department of Outdoor Ed, the WWW providers or teacher/chaperones. That information is the key resource for parents and students as they prepare for WWW.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES

Parents are integral to their child achieving success and personal growth during WWW. Parents can assist their child by:

- Attending the information sessions
- Assisting their child in making the WWW program decision that best supports their strengths and areas for growth
- Supporting the teachers/organizers by encouraging their child to value and be engaged in the program
- Ensuring that any additional paperwork or tasks are completed as requested
- Understanding that WWW is a mandatory part of the Nido curriculum and beneficial to students' learning and personal growth.



PASSPORT/ CARNET (RUT) AND LEGAL AUTHORIZATION

Most importantly, this is the ID number that will be used to arrange any travel logistics associated with your WWW program this year. Please be sure to submit the correct information. Non-Chilean students who hope to travel outside of Chile should travel with a passport, valid six months after the date of the WWW travel. Students under age 18 will also need to obtain a notarized permission to travel outside Chile without their parents/guardians. For any students who plan on staying in Chile for WWW this year, the Chilean RUT number is sufficient.
