WHY MENTORING MATTERS



55%

COLLEGE ENROLLMENT

Young adults who face an opportunity gap but have a mentor are **55% more likely to be enrolled in college** than those who did not have a mentor.*



SUPPORT AND RELATIONSHIPS

1 in 3 children don't have a mentor outside of their family.*



ATTENDANCE

Students who meet regularly with mentors are **52% less likely to skip a day of school**.*
