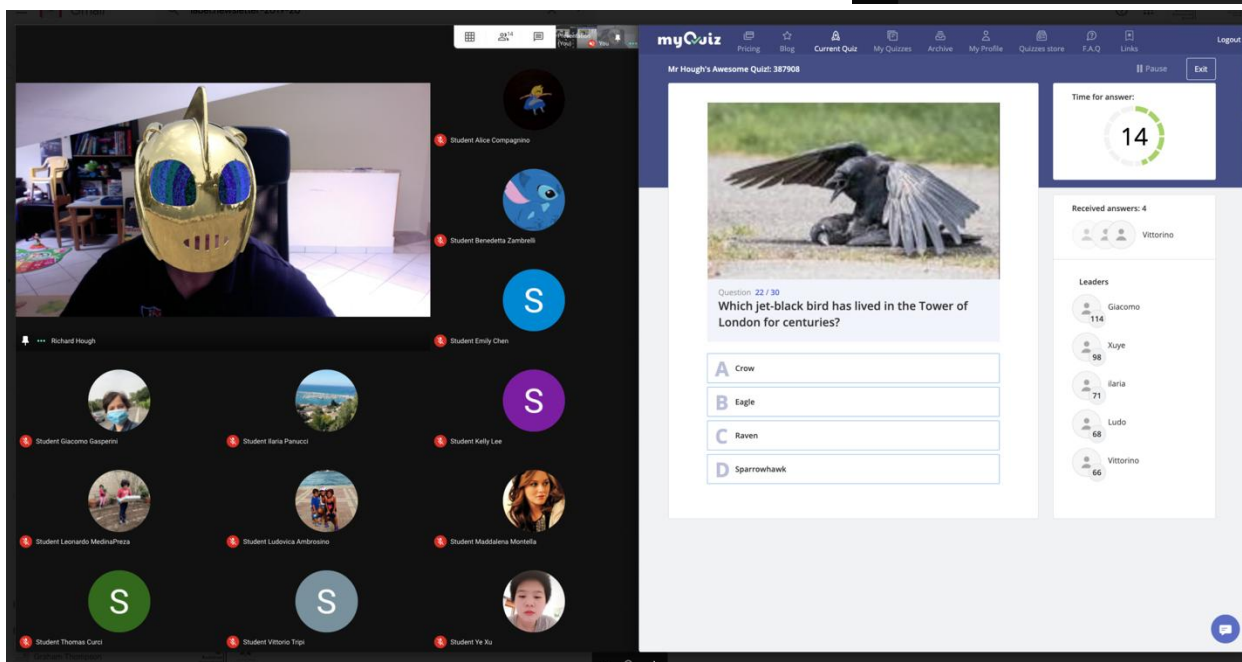
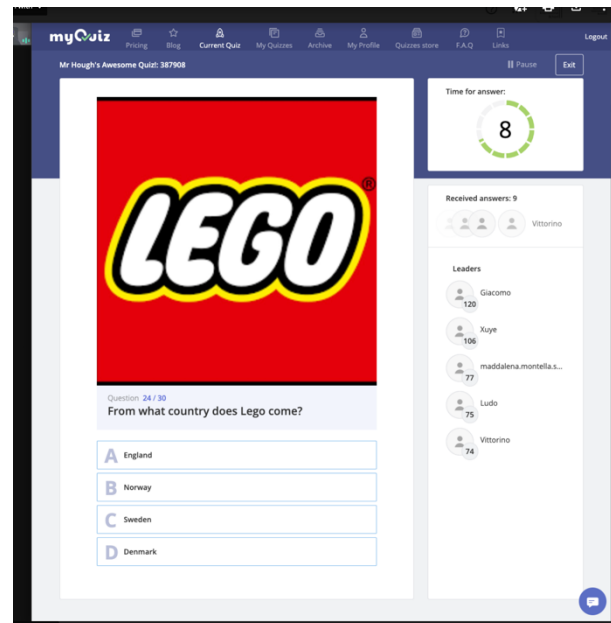


Wildlife Quiz in Year 6H

We had a lot of fun and really enjoyed the game; Giacomo and Xu Ye coming first and second respectively!

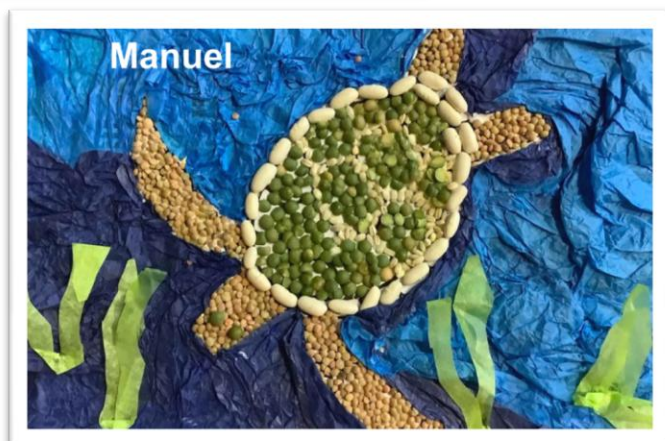
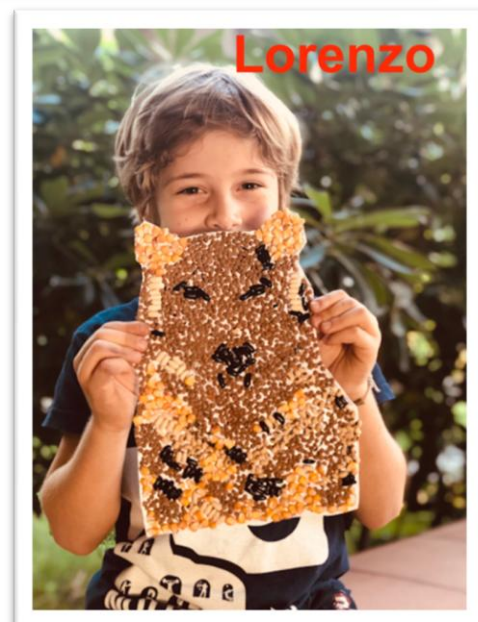
We will be doing it again in the last week of term, with some new questions and a range of video questions, to end the year on a high! **Richard Hough**
