  - b. If you will be in grade 8 next year, use Summer Book Guide 2020 Grade 8
    - \*These lists have also been emailed to you
- 2. Buy or borrow books you choose from the list. (Paper copies, eBooks and audiobooks are all allowed.)
- 3. Read a book of your choosing from the list, or a sequel to any book on the list. The only rule is that you have to be reading it for the first time. \*you can read other books if you want, but only books on the list will count towards winning the reading challenge.
- 4. Whenever you finish a book on the list or a sequel to a book on the list, go to the **Summer** Reading Form.
