1	General Use	Foot Injury	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wear safety shoes or boots w/reinforced toe (steel or composite)</li> </ul>
2	General Use	Bodily Injury	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wear appropriate clothing, including boots, long pants, gloves, and other PPE (as needed)</li> <li>• Keep all guards and shields in place</li> <li>• Keep hands, clothing clear of all moving parts</li> <li>• Secure long hair</li> <li>• If working overhead or anywhere subject to materials falling from overhead - wear a hard hat</li> </ul>
3	General Use	Injury to others	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Work area safety - Use cones, barricades, caution tape as needed</li> <li>• Post lookout to keep area clear and warn others to stay clear of area</li> </ul>
4	Preparing Gasoline Powered Equipment for Use	Fire-/Explosion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Always add fuel outdoors, ensure fuel cap is secure before use of equipment</li> <li>• Do not add fuel if near open flame or sparks</li> <li>• Clean up spilled fuel immediately; do not start engine until fumes have dispersed</li> <li>• Have a fire extinguisher nearby</li> </ul>

**Non-Slip Shoes, Rubber Gloves, Safety Glasses or Shield,**

Required Training:

**SAFESCHOOLS - Hand and Power tool Safety  
SAFESCHOOLS - General Safety Orientation  
SAFESCHOOLS - Lockout/tagout  
SAFESCHOOLS - Back Injury and Lifting**

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5	General Use	Inhalation of Dusts or Particulate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wear N95 dust mask</li> </ul>
6	General Use	Hearing Damage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wear hearing protection: ear plugs or earmuff headset</li> </ul>
7	Procedure for malfunctioning or broken equipment	Bodily Injury	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Obtain Accident Prevention Tag-mark equipment "Do Not Use" – specify problem or hazard</li> <li>• Whenever possible isolate power source so equipment cannot be used. (Lock Out- Tag Out)</li> <li>• Notify shop and/or take equipment to shop</li> </ul>
8	General Use	Chemical Exposure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wear appropriate clothing to cover exposed skin</li> <li>• Wear the appropriate gloves, safety glasses or safety goggles or face shield. NOTE: The product label and/or the SDS for all chemicals MUST be reviewed to determine the proper PPE!</li> </ul>
9	General Use	Eye Injury/Head Injury	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wear safety goggles or full face shield to prevent eye/face injury from flying wood chips, vegetation, etc.</li> <li>• Wear hard hat if subject to falling items or working over head</li> </ul>
10	Additional Precautions for Fuel	Injury and Fire	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Always operate in well-ventilated</li> </ul>

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	Powered Engines		area <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Never fuel engine while running</li><li>• Stop engine before performing maintenance or trouble shooting</li></ul>

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
