Preparing to Apply

- College Search on Naviance
- Colleges are offering Virtual Tours. Visit college websites for information.
- Finalize list of schools to apply to
 - Remember that applications range from \$0 to \$80

Letters of Recommendation

- If you haven't already asked a teacher to write a letter of recommendation, please do so ASAP!
- Request a google meet with the teacher so you can ask "in person"
- Send a request, via naviance, so the teacher can upload their letter on Naviance
- Communicate deadline dates with teacher(s)
 -please use the Teacher Recommendation form
- Allow one month notice for teachers to write letters.
- Do NOT wait until the last minute!
- Write a thank you letter. It takes a lot of time and effort for teachers to write a letter.

Early Decision vs. Early Action

•Early decision plans are binding. You agree to attend the college if it accepts you and offers an adequate financial aid package. Although you can apply to only one college for early decision, you may apply to other colleges through the regular admission process. If you're accepted by your first-choice college early, you must withdraw all other applications.

•Early action plans are similar to early decision plans, but are not binding. If you've been accepted, you can choose to commit to the college immediately, or wait until the spring. Under these plans, you may also apply early action to other colleges. Usually, you have until the late spring to let the college know your decision.



Email Address

Email addresses are necessary for online application accounts. Please make sure your address is appropriate--and students should **NOT** use their school email.



Naviance

- During the application process, students are expected to use Naviance E-Docs. By using Naviance E-Docs, our staff at SHS will be able to electronically submit transcripts and letters of recommendation to over 2,000 colleges/universities, including all Common App schools. Common App matching allows students to match their Naviance Student account to the Common App.
- Online submission of Documents and Requests will be made through Naviance Student.

Naviance

Add all colleges to Colleges I'm Thinking about-then click on the box next to the colleges you plan to apply to and click move to applications. When you move to applications MAKE SURE you check the box that says add and request transcript. Note which type of application you are requesting (early action, early decision, regular decision).



Common App Matching

- Go to www.commonapp.org
- Create a username and password
- Fill out information as First-Year Student
- Complete the Education tab and the Family Educational Rights (FERPA) Waiver. SHS School Counseling Department recommends that students waive his/her right to access his/her recommendation letter.
- List the schools you plan to apply to under my colleges tab
- Return to Naviance "Colleges I'm Applying To" page. Insert the email address you used to create your Common App account. This is a CRITICAL step as it will allow us to send supporting documents (transcripts and letters of recommendation) electronically.

UCONN Scholarships--Nutmeg/Day of Pride

Students must meet the following criteria to qualify for Day of Pride:

3.5 or higher GPA

AND

1170 SAT or 24 ACT

AND

Leadership

AND

Demonstrated commitment to multicultural diversity programs in school and/or community

UCONN Nutmeg/Day of Pride

Students must meet the following criteria to qualify for Nutmeg:

3.5 or higher GPA

AND

1370 SAT or 30 ACT

AND

Involved in leadership activities in school or community

UCONN Nutmeg/Day of Pride (con't)

UCONN **MUST** receive **ALL** documents by **November 1** for students to be eligible.
