

What's the Difference?

Knowing the difference between Advanced Placement and Dual Credit course will assist you in planning for both high school and college courses.

	Advanced Placement (AP)	Dual Credit		
Description	The AP Program allows students to take college-level courses and exams, and to potentially earn college credit or placement while still in high school.	Dual Credit allows high school students to earn both high school and college credit by completing courses at their high school and/or college campus.		
Enrollment	Enroll at high school campus Pre-AP courses offered in the 9 th and 10 th grades. AP courses offered at all grade levels No limit on the number of courses per semester	Enroll at high school campus Juniors and Seniors are eligible, Sophomore participating in a CTE certification program Must meet "College Ready" scores on Texas Success Initiative (TSI) Assessments May enroll in only 2 courses per semester, unless high school principal approve additional courses with a counselor's recommendation.
